QUOTES FROM CHAPTER ONE Pope Francis "Gaudete Et Exsultate"



The Letter to the Hebrews presents a number of testimonies that encourage us to "run with perseverance the race that is set before us" (12:1). It speaks of Abraham, Sarah, Moses, Gideon and others (cf. 11:1-12:3). Above all, it invites us to realize that "a great cloud of witnesses" (12:1) impels us to advance constantly towards the goal. These witnesses may include our own mothers, grandmothers or other loved ones (cf. 2 Tim 1:5). Their lives may not always have been perfect, yet even amid their faults and failings they kept moving forward and proved pleasing to the Lord.

The saints now in God's presence preserve their bonds of love and communion with us. The Book of Revelation attests to this when it speaks of the intercession of the martyrs: "I saw under the altar the souls of those who had been slain for the word of God and for the witness they had borne; they cried out with a loud voice, 'O sovereign Lord, holy and true, how long will it be before you judge?"" (6:9-10). Each of us can say: "Surrounded, led and guided by the friends of God... I do not have to carry alone what, in truth, I could never carry alone. All the saints of God are there to protect me, to sustain me and to carry me".[1]

Nor need we think only of those already beatified and canonized. The Holy Spirit bestows holiness in abundance among God's holy and faithful people, for "it has pleased God to make men and women holy and to save them. not as individuals without any bond between them, but rather as a people who might acknowledge him in truth and serve him in holiness".[3] In salvation history, the Lord saved one people. We are never completely ourselves unless we belong to a people. That is why no one is saved alone, as an isolated individual. Rather, God draws us to himself. taking into account the complex fabric of interpersonal relationships present in a human community. God wanted to enter into the life and history of a people.



I like to contemplate the holiness present in the patience of God's people: in those parents who raise their children with immense love, in those men and women who work hard to support their families, in the sick, in elderly religious who never lose their smile. In their daily perseverance I see the holiness of the Church militant. Very often it is a holiness found in our next-door neighbours, those who, living in our midst, reflect God's presence. We might call them "the middle class of holiness"

The processes of beatification and canonization recognize the signs of heroic virtue, the sacrifice of one's life in martyrdom, and certain cases where a life is constantly offered for others, even until death. This shows an exemplary imitation of Christ, one worthy of the admiration of the faithful.[2] We can think, for example, of Blessed Maria Gabriella Sagheddu, who offered her life for the unity of Christians



At A Different Stage



I'm so fortunate to be a part of a positive group of mothers who all had babies around the same time. In fact, all our children are only a few weeks apart.

To begin with our babies all tracked at the same developmental pace. But the older the get the more different they are.

Today I caught up with one of my mum friends and her daughter. Her daughter was one of the first of our bubs to get teeth. She has three times the amount of teeth as my son!

She's a gorgeous little girl who is super active and very smiley. She climbs around everywhere and loves to explore.

My son on the other hand tends to stay pretty close to me. He doesn't venture too far before turning around to make sure I'm still in sight.

But he's really getting a good handle on his words. He loves to say the name of animals, or at least the sound they make. He is able to say some of his favourite foods and has his version of the names of seven members of our family. And each day he adds another word to his repertoire. Today was "apple".

So he may still only have a couple of teeth and he's not as adventurous as some, he has strengths in other areas.

It's so hard for us to not compare our children to others the same age. In fact, it's hard for us to not compare ourselves to others, regardless of their age.

But watching my son and his peers has reminded me that God makes us all differently. He gives us our own strengths and allows us to develop in our own way. Comparing ourselves to someone else is such a waste of time and energy. Instead we should be investing in ourselves, and in others, to be all that God has created us to be.

Jesus, You didn't waste time comparing yourself to others on earth. You just stayed focussed on what your Godly mission was. May we pour ourselves into such endeavours as well. Amen.

An Office That Works

My husband recently had to get some things done at Officeworks. Over the course of two days he spent a couple of hours in the store and interacted with numerous staff members. As he finally completed his work he left the store reflecting on his time there. He was so impressed by the staff and their positive attitude, even at times when they were met by cranky customers who were in a hurry. He thought about jumping online to tweet Officeworks head office but worried his message wouldn't get back down to this level. So he turned around and went back into the shop to ask for the store manager. He found a female staff member who he had interacted with numerous times. She had been the friendliest most helpful staff member and had a great sense of humour. He asked her who the manager was and it just so happened to be her. He told her about the hours he had spent in the store and how impressed he was with the staff there. She was so happy to hear this. So often they only get told the negative things so it was lovely to hear the positives too. As my husband told me this encounter of his day it reminded me of two important things:

We can never encourage people enough. If we see or experience something positive we might think it but let's be more proactive about voicing our pleasure rather than just our disappointments

The leader has a big impact on the rest of the team. It didn't surprise me to hear that it was this particularly positive staff member who ended up being the manager. No wonder the rest of her team were positive as well.

Both these reminders show that we do have an impact on other people. We can either chose for that impression to be positive or decide to be indifferent about how we make people feel. People will leave feeling differently after meeting with you. Jesus once said that people will know if you follow Jesus by your love. If you love others then it speaks volumes of who you are committed to. May we live in such a loving positive way that it can never be deniable as to who we worship. Lord, You had an incredible impact on people. After they met you they were never the same again. Help us to be more conscious of how we impact others. May we work towards being a positive impact so that people may know we follow You. Amen. Would people recognise you as a Christian by your actions?

RESURRECTION PARISH GROUPS

18+

Each month this group of young adults meets for a meal, for friendship, and for faith. There are usually 30-40 who come.

There are three components to the 18+ dinners:

- Conversation over a meal
- A guest speaker
- An open forum

All three are important providing the opportunity for young people get to know one another, to learn, and to engage in discussions about contemporary issues.

If you would like to help plan, prepare, and engage speakers join this group.

55 Plus

What does it mean to be part of "55 plus" (ex seniors) group?

This is a group for young at heart.

The purpose of this group is to organise spiritual and social activities for our 55 plus Resurrection Parishioners. These activities include Anointing Masses, morning Teas, movies, lunches, outings and the major celebration each year; our Christmas Lunch.

All these events take time, effort and commitment for those who sign on to be part of the organising group. A parishioner can participate in the activities without being a member of the organising group.

However if you do sign on it will be your duty to help plan the activities this requires creativity. And then coming early to help set up and staying behind till all the cleaning and tidying up is completed; without being asked.

Please think very carefully before you commit yourself and understand the difference between being part of the organising group and simply coming to the functions.

To be part of all activities you don't need to be part of the organisation group.

Finance

The Parish Finance Group is a friendly team looking for new members. Anyone who is thinking of a way to help out in the Parish and you are money minded, we may be the right group for you!

Do you have an accounting background? Are you are a student completing a bookkeeping or finance course? Perhaps you are the person entrusted with the job of managing your household's finances? If you understand financial reports and budgets, feel free to join the Finance group.

This group performs an advisory role, assisting Father Noel in the administration of the parish finances - Examples of what our group discusses monthly- we review the parish Stewardship, monthly financial reports, give financial recommendations, review fundraising proposals, annual budgets of income and expenditure, plan for major capital works as well as advise the Parish Priest on all matters financial. We are a small group and we are keen to find new members.

Gardens/Maintenance

At Resurrection, we take pride in the look of our property. The gardens, church, school and hall - all areas look

loved. This group is responsible for maintaining and enhancing our property. Each member takes responsibility for a specific area - it might be a garden bed, the church, or even the drains. Each member has to take note of what might need to be done by a professional, at a working bee, or by a couple of parishioners during the week. Then, the scope of the work will be discussed and prioritised at the next Parish Meeting Night.

Go Make Disciples

At the very end of Matthew's Gospel Jesus says "Go make disciples". These words are now enshrined as our Parish Vision Statement.

Pope Francis captures the essence of Jesus' injunction when he challenges us to "Leave our comfort zones" and "Go to the peripheries". According to the 2011 census (the 2016 data is not yet available) 42,546 people live within our parish boundaries, of whom 14,746 identified as Catholic.

What can we do to engage with the wider group?

We have 353 families with children enrolled in our school and another 120 families with children enrolled at other schools but are in our Religious Education programme.

What are some creative ways we can meet, share and dialogue with these families?

How can we bring Pope Francis' inspiring words alive within our community?

Are there twelve disciples of the Risen Jesus here in our parish prepared to make a start on addressing some of these issues?

Remember "Go make disciples".

Liturgy

The word 'liturgy' comes from a Greek word meaning 'work'. Good liturgy requires work – it does not just happen. Liturgy at its best assists people to participate, praise, pray, worship and celebrate the Good News that the Risen Lord is indeed present.

You will find it a joy to be a part of this dynamic group. Ritual, proclamation, music, movement, singing, and environment all need to be integrated into the liturgy. While the major feasts (Christmas, Easter) require much forward planning, there are 34 weeks of ordinary time that also need the attention of this group. Special occasions such as baptisms, weddings and funerals are enhanced by the efforts of the Liturgy group, too.

C. S. Lewis once wrote: 'Praise is a mode of love which always has some element of joy in it.' This more than anything else sums up what good liturgy and a good Liturgy group can be.

Outreach

This group's aim is to 'reach out' to families with a member who has special needs, those grieving for the loss of a loved one, people challenged by grave sickness and carers. The Outreach group also welcomes those who are simply feeling lonely and need someone to talk to and mix with. Outreach tries to offer comfort and practical support. This group shows how much Resurrection Parish does care, understands and is willing to reach out.

RCIA Team

Do you have a friendly and welcoming personality? Are you willing to share your faith and life experiences with others? Do you have an ability to listen and respect another's opinion?

If your answer is 'Yes' consider joining the RCIA team. We are a team committed to sharing our faith and knowledge with adults wishing to become Catholics. The RCIA team might be the first encounter with the Catholic Church for our new candidates. RCIA deepens understanding of the Catholic faith, develops a relationship with Jesus, and shares knowledge of the Gospels, prayer and our community. Often, the team become not only mentors to our candidates, but also friends.



Getting to the Heart of the Gospel is the Key to Parish Evangelisation

In the first days of his pontificate Pope Francis addressed the College of Cardinals asking them to "find new ways to spread the word of God to every corner of the world."

(March 15, 2013)

We urgently need to find ways to reach people immersed in our modern culture and draw them into faith and Parish life. Alpha has been specifically designed to do this.



Planting seeds in concrete is not recommended

On the day of Pentecost, when the Apostles went out to preach, they didn't start with a systematic treatise from the Catechism. What the Apostles did on that day was to proclaim, in a very basic fashion, what God had done for the world in His Son Jesus. This proclamation was directed to the hearts of those listening to move them to make a decision to repent and to accept the love of God offered in Jesus. We call this first basic proclamation the 'Kerygma'. Only after the Kerygma has been heard and responded to, should the second, and very necessary, step be added: what's known as "didache" or catechesis.

It has been said that trying to catechize someone who has never been evangelized is like planting seeds in concrete; they won't grow. What does this mean? In our Parishes we tend to start faith formation right away with catechesis and have tended to assume people have already heard the Kerygma and responded to it by having made a decision to accept the love of God offered in Jesus. As we have said, this is like planting seeds in concrete.

The Alpha Course

Alpha allows anyone to explore life, faith and God in a friendly, open and informal environment. In each session there's food, a short talk and robust discussion in small groups. Participants are lead on a journey that frequently leads to a decision to develop a relationship with Jesus and to significant life change. 

Reading 1

Acts 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48

When Peter entered, Cornelius met him and, falling at his feet, paid him homage.

Peter, however, raised him up, saying, "Get up. I myself am also a human being."

Then Peter proceeded to speak and said, "In truth, I see that God shows no partiality.

Rather, in every nation whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him."

While Peter was still speaking these things, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who were listening to the word.

The circumcised believers who had accompanied Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit should have been poured out on the Gentiles also, for they could hear them speaking in tongues and glorifying God.

Then Peter responded, "Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people, who have received the Holy Spirit even as we have?" He ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ.

Reading 2 1 Jn 4:7-10

Beloved, let us love one another, because love is of God; everyone who loves is begotten by God and knows God. Whoever is without love does not know God, for God is love. In this way the love of God was revealed to us: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might have life through him. In this is love: not that we have loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as expiation for our sins.

Gospel

Jn 15:9-17

Jesus said to his disciples: "As the Father loves me, so I also love you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love.

"I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy might be complete. This is my commandment: love one another as I love you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I no longer call you slaves, because a slave does not know what his master is doing. I have

called you friends, because I have told you everything I have heard from my Father.

It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will remain, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name he may give you. This I command you: love one another."
