
Stewardship Prayer

"...for whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted." (Luke 18:14)

Pride and ego is the root cause of most of our sins. Thinking your time is so valuable, your talent is better than anyone else and your money gives you status is another way of making those things "gods" before God. Remember all those gifts were Godgiven. Instead we should be humbled by God's abundant generosity and our hearts should overflow with gratitude.

Working With Children's Check

AWorking with Children Check (WWCC) is a legal requirement for people engaged in child-related work as defined by the Working with Children Act 2005 (Vic).





In the Archdiocese of Melbourne all persons working or in ministry in parishes, agencies and entities hold a position of trust within the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne, irrespective of whether their role involves direct, indirect or no contact with children and young people must have a WWCC.

The WWCC excludes persons form workingwithchildren, and young people on the basis of their involvement in:

- Serious sexual offences
- Serious violent offences
- Serious drug offences





If a person declines to apply for or provide a WWCC, they are not permitted to engage in work or undertake a voluntary role within the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne.

If you don't have a WWCC, this is the application process:

- Apply online for the WWCC
- Link WWCC to Resurrection Catholic Church, Kings Park

For all volunteers the application is free.

Office staff are happy to help complete the application on your behalf.

ALL SOULS DAY MASS

All Souls Day is a holy day set aside for honoring the dead. As a Christian community, our belief in the resurrection of Jesus provides the context for our faith and hope in the resurrection of the dead. When viewed in this way death becomes in a very real sense, the only gate way to this eternal life of love with God and those we love.



REFLECTION by Diane Bergant CSA

It is very easy for religious people to fall into a kind of self-righteousness. Their very enthusiasm and generosity can plant the seeds of religious arrogance. They know what commitment demands of them; they experience relative success in their endeavors to be faithful; they distance themselves from what they think might threaten their resolve; and then they pass judgment on those who do not share their values or experience their success. This kind of arrogance is often imperceptible, because there is enough truth in every step along the way that it is difficult to recognise when one is veering off the track.

Jesus extols the humility of the one who admits being a sinner, and can accept the implications of that admission. This is the kind of prayer that is described in the reading from Sirach and the psalm response. It is those who can admit that they are needy who turn to God in that need. It is those who trust that God will be their strength in the face of their weaknesses who are strengthened.

Paul's own prayer demonstrates the attitudes that should be ours as we pray. Like the Pharisee, he acknowledges his success. He has competed well; he has finished the course; he has kept the faith. However, unlike the Pharisee, he acknowledges that God is the source of any good he has been able to accomplish. The Lord stood by him and gave him strength. If there is any glory, it belongs to God. Paul's confident prayer springs from a humble heart.

Reference: Then Peter came to himself and said, "Now I know without a doubt that the Lord has sent his angel and rescued me from Herod's clutches and from everything the Jewish people were hoping would happen." (Acts 12:11 NIV)

Explore: There's a well known poem about someone walking across a beach with God. It's called Footprints in the Sand:

One night I dreamed I was walking along the beach with the Lord.

Many scenes from my life flashed across the sky.

In each scene I noticed footprints in the sand.

Sometimes there were two sets of footprints,

other times there were one set of footprints.

This bothered me because I noticed

that during the low periods of my life,

when I was suffering from

anguish, sorrow or defeat,

I could see only one set of footprints.

So I said to the Lord,

"You promised me Lord,

that if I followed you,

you would walk with me always.

But I have noticed that during

the most trying periods of my life

there have only been one

set of footprints in the sand.

Why, when I needed you most,

you have not been there for me?"

The Lord replied,

"The times when you have

seen only one set of footprints,

is when I carried you."

Such a powerful poem that explains how God is always with us, especially during our times of hardship. It's just that often we don't notice His company at these times until we stop and look back.

Application: The apostle Peter was experiencing a particularly difficult time. His fellow disciple, James, had been killed by the king and now he found himself heading towards the same fate.

This passage in Acts describes Peter's incredible escape from prison, one of my all time favourite interventions

of God. However, it's not until Peter goes through the experience that he realises God has a finally carried him through this situation.

Once a time of trial is over it becomes much easier to see God's involvement. When we are going through tough times our heads are filled with emotion and concern.

It's important for us to remember to continuously rely on God during our suffering, but when the seas are starting to calm let's not forget to look back to see how much God was carrying us through.

Prayer: Lord, You promised never to leave us. Although there are times when we feel alone, we know You are faithful and true to Your word. Help us. in our time of trial. to feel Your loving arms as You carry us through. Amen.

When have you needed God to carry you?

Unexpected Grief

n 6 June 2002, I found myself unable to offer help. On the last day of her junior year of high school, our 17 year old daughter Melissa was killed in a car accident.

In one horrible instant, everything we knew about God and the Bible and heaven was put to the test. We needed the Christian community to guide us toward hope as we stood at the funeral of a beloved young woman who had touched so many lives with her smile, her godliness, her love of life, and her car for others.

For many weeks, I couldn't write. What could I say? How could I find the words to help others when my family - when I needed so much?

Now, months later as I begin to write again I can say that God has not changed. He is still our loving heavenly Father, the "God of all comfort" (2 Corinthians 1:3). He is still the source of hope in the face of unexpected grief. I write of Him with a renewed sense of my need for His touch, His love, His strength. Broken, I write of the only One who can make us hole. - Dave Branon

The Spring Heart

Daffodils, jonquils, stocks – it's beginning to look like and have the to look like and have the smell of spring! All of a sudden it seems as though daylight lasts a little longer, and the sun seems to shine a little more brightly. There is a sense that the earth is gradually re-awakening as the fruits of the hidden underground work are starting to be revealed. It is a season of growth and great beauty. With the eyes of faith we cannot help but be drawn into a sense of wonder about God's presence in our world expressed in creation.

And spring proclaims new life! Our lives are not always in sync with the natural season, however. Sometimes we may be experiencing the autumn of life in the midst of spring. Just as the season around us seems to sing with joy we may be in the midst of a mourning time, wishing that the trees reflected our sense of loss by losing their leaves not growing them. The very thought of new life may seem impossible to us. Even the brightness of the sun contains a shadow.

But perhaps this is the lesson the season of spring offers us. Regardless of how we feel or what we are experiencing it is a sign that new life will always emerge. Robert H. Schuller, an American poet and Christian evangelist expresses it this way: "Never cut a tree down in the wintertime. Never make a negative decision in the low time. Never make your most important decisions when you are in your worst moods. Wait. Be patient. The storm will pass. The spring will come".

So let our hearts prepare for spring! Pope Francis in his encyclical Laudato Si (On the care of our common home) notes that 'A sense of deep communion with the rest of nature cannot be real if our hearts lack tenderness, compassion and concern for our fellow human beings (n. 91). Perhaps this is a clue to cultivating a spring heart: just as the daffodils are emerging from the safety of the warm earth perhaps we are being invited to take a little risk with our hearts. To be more tender and kind and to turn our face to the other. To open our eyes to the wonder of the world around us in order that we may show that the world really does proclaim the glory of God. And to remember that the paschal mystery is for us not a memory, but a pattern of our lives.

In the words of the prayer attributed to St Francis of Assisi:

Lord, make me an instrument of Your peace.

Where there is hatred, let me sow love:

where there is injury, pardon;

where there is doubt, faith;

where there is despair, hope;

where there is darkness, light;

where there is sadness, joy.

O, Divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled

as to console:

to be understood as to understand:

to be loved as to love:

For it is in aiving that we receive;

it is in pardoning that we are pardoned;

it is in dying that we are born again to eternal life.

Parish Ministry How will you serve?

Serving others is central to being a Christian. It is recorded John's Gospel that after Jesus had washed the disciples' feet he said, "So if I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet" (Jn. 13:14). The word "Ministry" comes from a Latin word meaning service. Every Christian should take this instruction of Jesus seriously. Most Catholics serve others by participating in a ministry in their parish.

Are you following Jesus' instruction? In what way do you serve? It does not matter if you are new to Resurrection or you have been here for a long time there is a ministry for you. Please read the following description of each Resurrection Ministry and then make a one year commitment to at least one Ministry. Complete the attached form and return to the Parish Office or Welcome Desk.

Camera Operator

Would you like to help with the data projection? Are you currently helping with the data projection? Would you like to operate the camera during 10.30am Mass? If your answer to any of these questions is yes, this might be your ministry.

Christmas/Easter Brochure Delivery

Within Resurrection parish there are approximately 13.500 homes. At Christmas and Easter each of these homes receives our specially designed brochure with an invitation to join our celebrations.

Our parish is divided into 38 zones so each person committing to this ministry has about 400 brochures to deliver by way of a letter-box drop.

Church Flowers

Except for Advent and Lent there are flowers in our church all the year. The parish purchases the flowers; but they need to be arranged.

Some people have a real gift in flower arrangement. If this is you this might be your ministry.

Coffee Clean Up

Perhaps some might see this as less glamorous than actually making the coffee but it is surely no less important. It is like being at home and doing the dishes. Somebody has to do it. Some parishioners find real joy in serving others.

Again working as a team and taking a turn to clean up can be fun. It is also a great way to meet other parishioners.

This is an ideal ministry for a family to take on together. How about taking a turn once a month?

Choirs/Music

Being part of a choir is pure joy for many people. You might be a couple or a single person or perhaps a family; by joining a choir you will get to know and make friends with other talented Resurrection parishioners.

Resurrection is blessed to have nine parish choirs. Each choir has its own distinctive style. All our choirs welcome new members. If you are already in a choir when signing up for please indicate the name of your present choir.

Church Cleaning

"Many hands make light work" This proverb certainly rings true when it comes to church cleaning. Our church is well used over the course of a week. It needs to be cleaned.

Paying professional cleaners would be very expensive. So parishioners committing to this ministry are doing two things; firstly they return our church to a state were we can worship and secondly they save the parish a lot of money. There are usually eight teams so a turn every eight weeks would seem reasonable. Cleaning happens on either of Friday or Saturday morning, usually around 9.00 am.

Joining other parishioners in this ministry is a great way of meeting people. Alternately you might like the flexibility of having your own team. All you need to do is gather 5 or 6 other parishioners to join you.



Coffee Maker

The espresso coffee machine in our narthex requires skill to use. You can be taught. This is a fun ministry for those over 15 year of age. Depending on the time of the Mass you might take a turn once every five or six weeks to help make coffee, tea, and hot chocolate. You will be working as a team with other parishioners. If you know how to use a large espresso machine or be willing to learn this can be a ministry for you.

Counting

Each week on either a Sunday or Monday morning our weekend collections are counted. As money is involved the counting has to be done both accurately and professionally.

Usually there are eight counting teams so depending on the number committing to this ministry a turn every two months is likely. We have a coin-counting machine that has cut down the time involved.

This is a terrific way of getting to know other parishioners.

Food Preparation

There are some chefs both professional and amateur in the parish that might choose this as their ministry.

During the year we have some functions based around a meal. It might be for Prep families, families with children having special needs, a day for all Parish Groups, a lunch for new parishioners or a host of other functions.

On days such as these it would be great to have a couple of parishioners to call on to help prepare the food. The parish will supply the food but the preparation is another matter.

Can you help? You might consider helping the "chefs" by serving the food or you can help by cleaning up.

Collector

Being a Collector is a ministry. Some might see this ministry as no more than passing the collection basket. But when you stop and think of what is being collected and the reason for a collection it takes on a different meaning. Why? Because what is collected comes from Resurrection parishioners; it is their Stewardship offering. This offering enables the mission of the Risen Jesus entrusted to the parishioners of Resurrection to continue. A certain graciousness and a friendly smile will always make this a more rewarding ministry.

Data Projector

The data projector in the church has provided a new way to serve others. This means setting up before the 6.00pm mass and packing up afterwards. On a Sunday it is setting up before 9.00am mass and packing up after the 10.30 am mass. You need to arrive 10 minutes early to set up. Training will be provided; ideal way for young people to be involved. Perhaps you might like to help create the data slides on MS PowerPoint.

Gardening

One of the first things visitors to Resurrection notice and comment on are our gardens. They are much admired and have been loved to life by many people over the years.

Our four annual working bees achieve good results. But weeds do grow, lawns need cutting, and roses need pruning. Again this ministry has flexibility as regards to day and time. Parishioners committing to this ministry can work by themselves or with others. A parishioner might commit to a particular garden to look after. It would be ideal for anybody not in full-time work and perhaps would get somebody "out of the house".



Hospitality

Hospitality and Christianity go together. It is never just an add-on. Fortunately Resurrection parishioners embrace this tenet of our faith by making Hospitality one of our most popular ministries. It involves taking a turn once every five or six weeks to greet people as they arrive for Mass, offer new parishioners a "New Parishioner Pack", provide information at the Welcome Desk as required, and generally be on the lookout to help people. After Mass the Hospitality Minister offers the Parish Bulletin to parishioners as they leave. This is an ideal ministry for an individual parishioner or a whole family might be involved.

Because greeting parishioners as they arrive is part of this ministry it follows that Hospitality Ministers need to come 20-30 minutes before Mass commences when they are "on duty". There will be a training session for all parishioners committing to this ministry.

Maintenance

As the name implies this ministry is to help maintain our property and plant. Are you a handy person? Can you change a light globe? Are you "good with your hands"? You can choose to work alone or with another parishioner. You can choose to come in regularly (say on a Tuesday morning) or simply come as needed.

Parish Office Cleaning

It would be a significant cost to the parish if professional cleaners were employed to clean the Parish Office. Since the Parish Office opened over eight years ago a small number of dedicated parishioners come to clean the Parish office. Depending on the number who commit to this ministry a turn once every seven or eight weeks would seem reasonable. The good thing is that you can clean the office at a time to suit you — as the Parish Office is open seven days a week.

Sacristan

After Mass there is both cleaning and tidying to be done. Sacred vessels need to be washed, and stored. Liturgical books need to be put away. Sacristies need to be tidied. All this takes between ten and fifteen minutes.

Special Minister of Communion

For over fifty years it has been possible for nonordained persons to assist in the distribution of Holy Communion. Often called Eucharistic Ministers people called to this ministry have the honour along with the priest of offering the Body or Blood of Christ to worshippers.

It is therefore self-evident that a person called to this ministry must have a love of Eucharist themselves. Eucharist must be distributed with reverence. There are proper procedures. Looking at these procedures at a training session will deepen your understanding of Eucharistic theology and help us to realize it is a privilege to offer the Body or Blood of Christ to another person.

Working Bees

During the year there are four Saturday morning working bees. The parish Maintenance Group plans the scope of works; however how many jobs get completed depends on how many people come to the working bee. Working bees are usually in February, June, September and November. Perhaps this is this where you can serve. Is this your ministry?

Office Help

Our Parish Office is a very busy place. If you would like to help with photo copying, filing, answering the telephone, using a computer and the like please make this your ministry. You could help on a regular basis or be on call when help is urgently needed.

Proclaimer of the Word

"When Scriptures are read in the Church, God himself is speaking to his people, and Christ, present in his own Word, is proclaiming the Gospel". This quote is from the General Instruction of the Roman Missal and perhaps best catches the importance of Proclamation in Catholic Liturgy. The Ministry of Proclamation needs first of all a love of God's Word. Liturgy demands a proclamation, it follows that Proclaimer rather than Reader better describes this ministry. Careful preparation goes hand in hand with this ministry. There will be a training session for all Proclaimers, readings are available two weeks in advance, and a pronunciation guide is provided. Why not experience the thrill of Proclaiming God's Word to the assembly?

Supper Club

Do you enjoy baking a cake? There are occasions during the year when it would be good to have someone bake a cake, make some sandwiches, or bake some biscuits. The occasion might be a special parish gathering, a vigil for a funeral, or a parish meeting. If you commit to this ministry you might be called on five or six time during the year. This is a very good stay-at-home ministry and yet very important.

Watering

Our parish is concerned about the environment and conserving water is a priority. Ten water tanks have been installed along with a watering system. But taps need to be turned on as required during the summer and as permitted. There are some gardens that need to be watered by hand.

We ask you, brothers and sisters, with regard to the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and our assembling with him, not to be shaken out of your minds suddenly, or to be alarmed either by a "spirit," or by an oral statement, or by a letter allegedly from us to the effect that the day of the Lord is at hand.

Gospel

LK 19:1-10

At that time, Jesus came to Jericho and intended to pass through the town. Now a man there named Zacchaeus, who was a chief tax collector and also a wealthy man, was seeking to see who Jesus was; but he could not see him because of the crowd, for he was short in stature. So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree in order to see Jesus, who was about to pass that way. When he reached the place, Jesus looked up and said, "Zacchaeus, come down quickly, for today I must stay at your house." And he came down quickly and received him with joy. When they all saw this, they began to grumble, saying, "He has gone to stay at the house of a sinner." But Zacchaeus stood there and said to the Lord, "Behold, half of my possessions, Lord, I shall give to the poor, and if I have extorted anything from anyone I shall repay it four times over." And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house because this man too is a descendant of Abraham. For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost."



Reflection Change of Heart

It is only with the heart that we can repent rightly. Repentance must involve a change of heart. Anything less won't produce a new being. It will be like decapitating weeds while leaving their roots intact. But if we change our hearts, then we will change our lives too. After his encounter with Jesus, Zacchaeus' heart burst into life like a desert landscape after a rainfall. Fear can't produce a conversion of heart; only an encounter with love can. Zacchaeus' conversion was a conversion to goodness. All of us stand in daily need of such a conversion. We need to move from a closed heart to an open heart, from a heart of stone to a heart of flesh.
