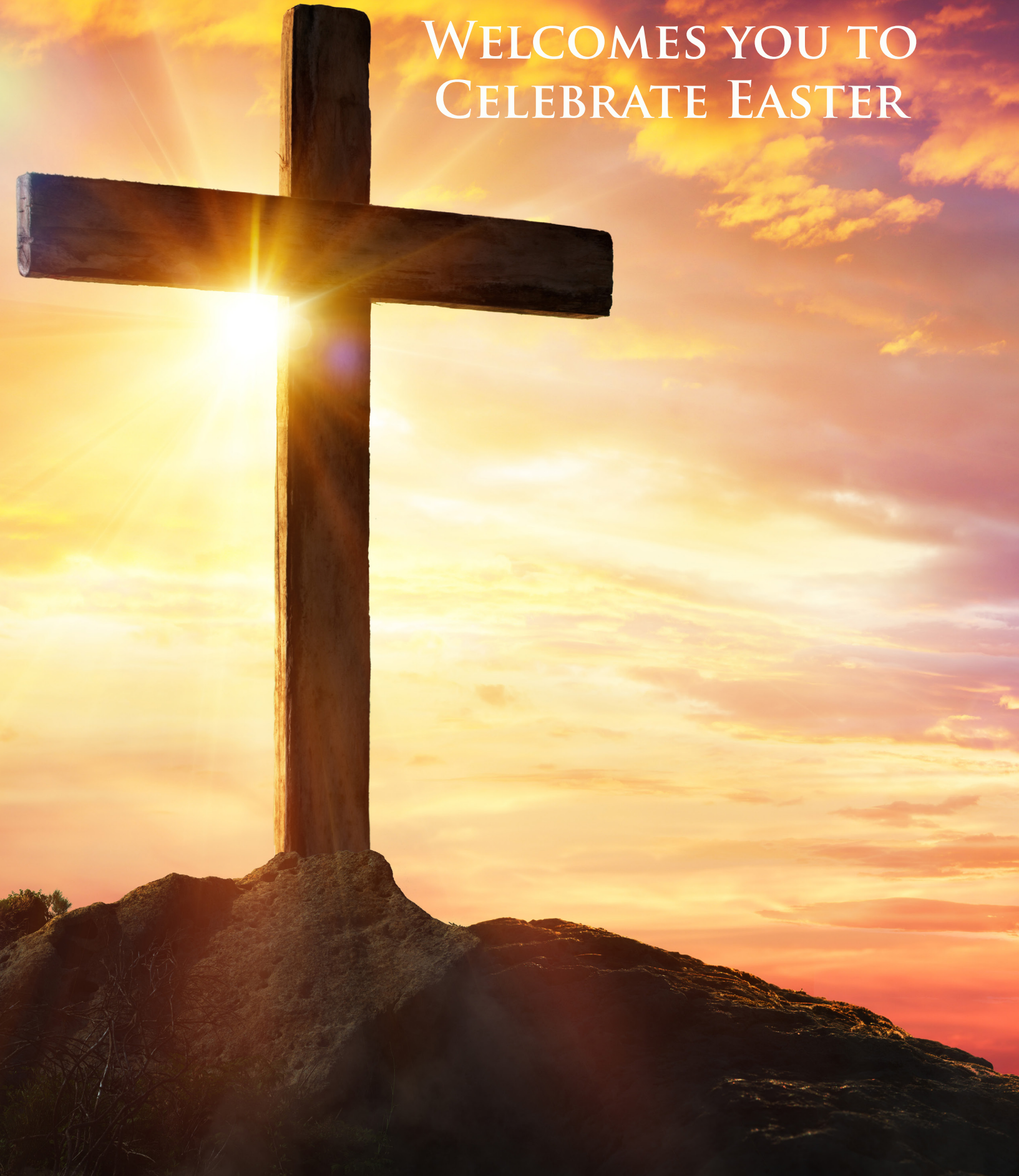

WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK

The Working with Children Check assists in protecting children from sexual or physical harm by ensuring that people who work with, or care for, them are subject to a screening process.

Passing a Check is a legal requirement for everyone in Victoria doing paid or voluntary child-related work who doesn't qualify for an exemption.

The Check is just a starting point. The Check does not assess a person's suitability to work with or care for children in a particular role. It is the responsibility of organisations to assess paid and voluntary workers' suitability to work with children and to establish sound, ongoing supervision practices so that children are safe from harm.

Organisations must comply with the Child Safe Standards that have been introduced as part of the Victorian Government's response to the Betrayal of Trust Inquiry. These are compulsory minimum standards under the Child Wellbeing and Safety Act 2005 that apply to organisations that provide services for children. The standards help ensure the safety of children. Organisations must also comply with the Reportable conduct scheme requirements.

Renewal of Church Gardens

At Resurrection Parish we are blessed with beautiful facilities including our garden space. But like any facility from time to time they need to be renewed and upgraded. Our gardens are in need of renewal and upgrade and works will commence soon. The motivation for undertaken these works are safety, reduce maintenance and most importantly enhance the beauty of the church and surrounds. The works will take place in three stages outlined below.

Stage 1 Preparation of the grounds beginning 1st May

- Large scale pruning, tree and stump removal works to the gardens as indicated on site plan. Gardens will also have old mulch removed and be prepared for new plantings to proceed.
- Major garden bed renovation works to occur to the gardens behind the church adjacent to the car park. Works include extension of paths, replacement of dead plants and a new irrigation system to the area.
- Presbytery gardening works include cutting and removal of the concrete along the fence line to create a new garden bed. New soil, plants and mulch for this garden. Clean up and pruning of the front garden space also.

At the end of this stage you will notice a significance and dramatic change, but the landscapers say that this is necessary preparation.

Stage 2 to be gazetted to church community May

- Develop a new planting plan and schedule to re plant and landscape the front gardens of the church. This plan will include new planting scope and layout of plantings to be completed including costings. New works plan to be posted on the church notice board during May.

Stage 3 installation of all plants in June/July

- Installation of plants as per planting plan to re plant and landscape the front gardens of the church.

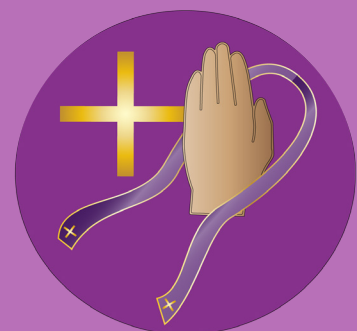
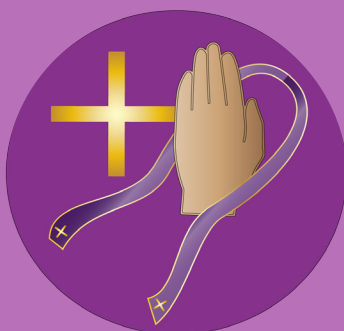

Death, Resurrection and the Priestly Abuse Phenomenon

In the Lenten season, one is inevitably brought to think of death and resurrection, of sacrifice and renewal, and of the conditions for 'a more abundant life'. Jesus's death is a willed and self-sacrificial one; his resurrection signals the triumph over death- and thus a reason for Hope. At times, however, death is self-inflicted- and priestly abuse, which is the very antithesis of Gospel values and priestly responsibilities, is very much of that order. Death has been brought to the Church by a thousand cuts. It will take a lot of work and a lot of humility to bring renewed confidence and energy to 'the body of Christ'.

There are many factors that have conspired to half-bury the Church over its long history- the venality of its key agents, including Popes and bishops, the selling of Indulgences, the Inquisition, bad governance, the putting of the good name of the Church ahead of the pain of suffering victims, the poor reflection of Gospel values, etc. If the real Church is 'the people of God'- the people who actually respect God and His life-giving values- then we ought to be profoundly shocked but not entirely despondent. Didn't Jesus himself assure Peter that the 'gates of Hell' would never prevail against His Church? And, as St Paul reminds us, if God is with us, who can prevail against us? Even if we are in a period of some despondency and loss, we can prepare for the renewal or resurrection of the good name of the Church with some confidence.

The Church is at once a spiritual entity and a visible, very human institution. Its best periods are when the two sides, spiritual and administrative, cohere and the Holy Spirit suffuses individuals and indeed the whole institution. Its leaders, including Popes and bishops- usually clerical all and masculine to boot- have often been named and shamed by History through their rejection of Gospel values and, especially, their scandalous behaviour. If you find this hard to believe, read about the Borgia Popes from the Middle Ages. No wonder a strong corrective was needed and by the 16th century the Reformation,

and Protestantism itself, emerged as a reaction. This led the Church to respond in turn through what is known as the Counter-Reformation. This set the Church on a corrective and disciplined path for the next 400 years- that is until Vatican II [1962-65]. Near death was followed by renewal. Vatican II itself was an act of renewal against ossification in a world that was changing fast.

Of course, side-by-side with its all too human, too sinful side [because it is led by men who are capable all of sin and yield to it too easily] is the more Spirit-filled side, animated as it is by its unrepeatable source and exemplar, Christ himself. I came across these unforgettable figures more than a decade ago and they bear repeating: the Church then had control of 80,000 schools, 5000 hospices, 20,000 hospitals and 3000 universities or institutions of higher learning... What an incredible force for good! To all this we must add the veritable army of Brothers and Sisters and priests and other volunteers who have inspired and helped tens of millions. Think of our own Saint Mary Mackillop who started the tradition of Catholic schools in Australia and the Josephite Order to make it all a reality. Think of how she moulded an egalitarian order, when in Europe Orders were still guided by ideas of class. There is no doubting her genuine claims to sainthood and exemplarity.

It can be surmised that the Holy Spirit flows more strongly in some areas of the Church than in others, on to some individuals and not others, especially when it finds doors slammed shut in its face. The teachings of the Church are usually beyond reproach, but it's a pity that many cannot live out the very virtues that they preach. To have 500,000 priests on the books is, on paper, a great asset, but to learn [through the recent Royal Commission] that between 4-7% of them were involved in either perpetrating or condoning sexual abuse is a real dagger through the heart of sincere believers. On the other hand, we should celebrate the 90+% ones who are good men, who have lived and live a life of sacrifice and service for the sanctification of others. Some have even had the courage to decry the Church's inaction in the midst of scandal and paid a price.

It's not for nothing that Francis of Assisi heard the mysterious call of 'Save my Church'- and he set up his Franciscan Order to do just that. It is also not for nothing that the present Pope chose to call himself Francis. He has been desperately trying to pull the Church out of trouble ever since. He has set himself on a course of humility, compassion and generosity towards the marginalised. He does not live in the papal apartments and even pays for his shoes; these had usually been donated. He actually lives very unostentatiously.

He has focused his analysis of what went wrong in the epidemic of clergy abuse on 'clericalism'- a distorted view of the priesthood, made worse by the often naked exercise of power. There is too much of the vestiges of the Feudal System in the administration of the Church. If the Pope no longer sees himself as an out-and-out monarch, why do bishops call themselves Monsignors? Why are priests often little kings in their own parish/towns? Service and gentle authority are what the Gospel demands, not power and social influence.

So what we need is the spirit of service, humility and openness at all levels of the Church. Openness means more of a role for laypersons, not excluding women and the young. Much of the abuse could have been avoided if priests everywhere were not only responsible for the parish but responsible to it through properly constituted Parish Councils. I know of parents who were cowered into silence and defeat or had nowhere to turn to, when abuse was actually uncovered... More democracy is needed at all Church levels.

Priests, of course, have their own unique spiritual role, especially when everything goes well. They uniquely are able to conduct Mass, dispense sacraments and offer spiritual guidance. They may be good people or not, good administrators or not, spiritual guides or not. As in any Bell Curve Distribution, some excel, some are adequate and some are bad and incompetent people. In the 21st Century, there are lay people who have solid administrative experience and can help; there are some who are as solid theologically- and there are fundamentally good people who can assist, and if need

be, judge, inspire or condemn. Lay people should share in the burden of carrying parishes and not merely as good flower ladies, gardeners or tradies.

From era to era, the Church seems to undergo a near-death experience, but we are convinced the Holy Spirit is not far and the heaven left behind by Jesus will help the bread of life to rise fully again in the Church, fresh and unsullied, to more fully satisfy souls. The Royal Commission itself must be seen as a providential agent for cleansing and change- and not as an unwanted intruder. After all, the Holy Spirit does move in mysterious ways.

Jesus was tempted non-stop in the desert and he overcame the temptations of power and riches. We too, clerics or lay people, will be tempted and at times it will prove too attractive to resist. We must keep in mind the basic equation of baptism [which we witness so often] as dying to sin and rising to new life in Christ. St Paul describes the secret of a good life as 'conforming ourselves to Christ'. This means opening ourselves fully to His message and example and allowing, through prayer and exercises like the Lenten ones, the Holy Spirit to suffuse us with His power. This recipe is good for institutions as well as individuals. Key questions are: how far can we transform ourselves using Christ as an inspiration and yardstick? How courageous will we prove to be in the face of multiple temptations? How repentant, if we deviate? How can we, the Church and individual believers, use the Lenten season to mend our ways?

Easter time will always be with us, but there must constantly be an Easter of the heart and of institutions, so we can die to sin and arise with Jesus to a more abundant life. Institutionally and personally, we must internalise Easter's timeless salvific message much better than we have. And then we may inherit of New Pentecosts and miraculous and healing outpourings of the Holy Spirit. 'Sleepers, wake,/ rise from the dead,/ and Christ will shine on you.' [Eph. 5:14]

I was caught up in spirit on the Lord's day and heard behind me a voice as loud as a trumpet, which said, "Write on a scroll what you see." Then I turned to see whose voice it was that spoke to me, and when I turned, I saw seven gold lampstands and in the midst of the lampstands one like a son of man, wearing an ankle-length robe, with a gold sash around his chest. When I caught sight of him, I fell down at his feet as though dead. He touched me with his right hand and said, "Do not be afraid. I am the first and the last, the one who lives. Once I was dead, but now I am alive forever and ever. I hold the keys to death and the netherworld. Write down, therefore, what you have seen, and what is happening, and what will happen afterwards."

Gospel

Jn 20:19-31

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.
